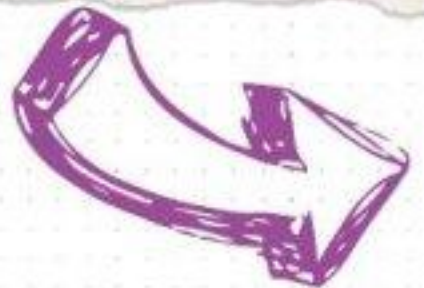

Tía Roqueta had a special gift: her voice. On full moon nights, she sang songs so sweet that fishermen thought they heard mermaids, but her husband always said proudly:

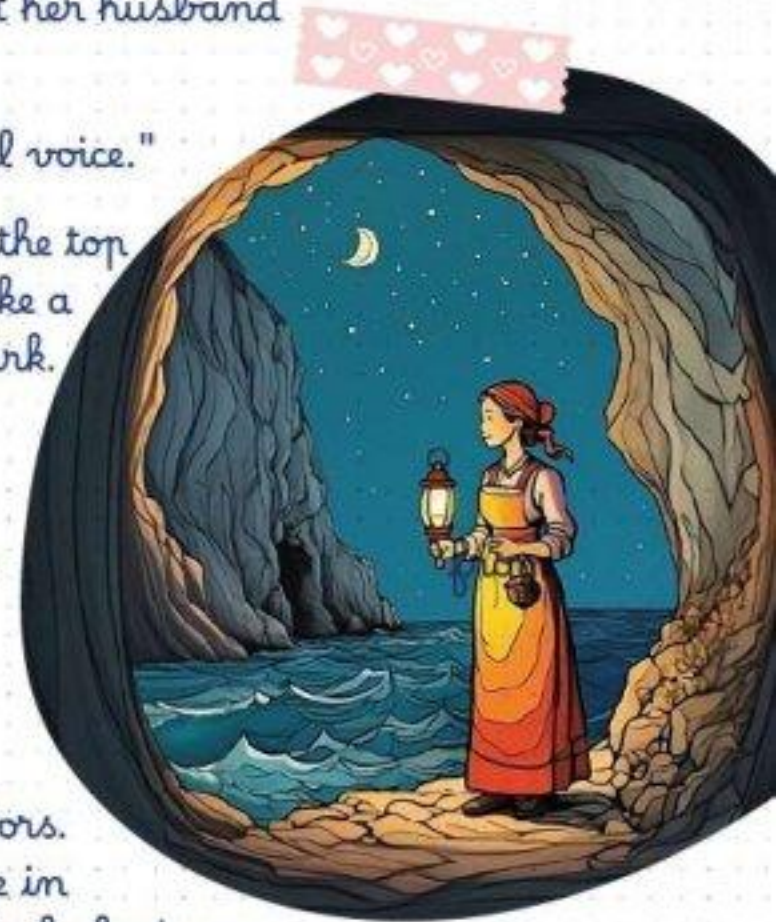
"It's my Tía Roqueta, the woman with the most beautiful voice."
